Journeying further... into Ancient Greece

Be creative in the way you present your work it can be on the computer, handwritten, photographed or even a video. Most importantly.....ENJOY!

Research the battle of Marathon. Create a poster persuading Ancient Greek men and boys to join the army to take part in the battle.



Write a recipe for a Greek dish (pastitsio is my favourite). Can you add your own adaptation to it? If you decide to test your recipe and cook your creation, make sure to take a photo! Find out some simple Greek phrases. E.g Hello, How are you? What's your name? etc. Can you make a poster to display them in Greek and English? If you can learn the pronunciation, can you try and teach us at school?

Make a collage using pictures from holiday brochures or the internet showing ancient buildings and interesting places to visit in Greece. (We have some brochures in school if you would like to use them.) Create a short presentation about the origin of the Olympic games, you could include how they differed from the modern Olympics which is happening this summer.

Who was Pythagoras? How is he linked to maths? What is Pythagoras' theory? Present your findings and use diagrams to explain what you have learnt.

Here are some activities that will support your child's learning journey this half term. A minimum of one of these is to be completed this term and can be submitted at any time to receive 5 team points. The work will be presented to the class and displayed in school.
