### Free bike safety check ups

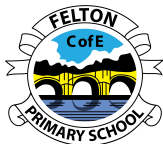

**Friday:** *Arrive in School jumper ready for our trip. (combined with non uniform if you wish) Packed Lunch required.*

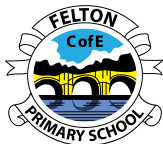
## Messy Church
