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Summer Term Forest and PE

Explorers are required to bring in PE kit Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Explorers will continue to have their Forest session every Friday.

<u>Adventurers Year 1 & 2</u> will have an indoor PE session on a Wednesday. They will also have an outdoor PE session on a Thursday with an external coach.

Voyagers Year 3 & 4 will have Forest this term, every Thursday afternoon and therefore will need to bring warm layers to wear under school waterproofs. All children should bring Wellington boots to wear. They will also have an outdoor PE session on a Friday with an external coach.

Pioneers Year 5 & 6 will be swimming this term and will need to bring in a swimming kit on a Wednesday (Please contact the school office if you are able to help and we can create a parent rota). They will also have an outdoor PE session on a Friday with an external coach.

For clarification:

Indoor PE kit - plain black shorts & PE T-shirts (red, blue or green depending upon school team). We prefer children to go barefoot for indoor activities.

Outdoor PE Kit - plain black shorts or plain black jogging bottoms/leggings for colder months. School sweatshirts can be worn. Sandshoes or trainers are essential for outdoor purposes.

Forest - warm layers to wear under school waterproofs. All children should bring Wellington boots to wear.

Although your child will have designated P.E days, we encourage P.E kits to be kept in school to allow flexibility. A named drawstring bag is ideal for keeping P.E. equipment in and we discourage large sports bags because of limited space in the cloakrooms. To avoid misunderstanding, all property, especially clothing, should be clearly marked with the name of your child.
