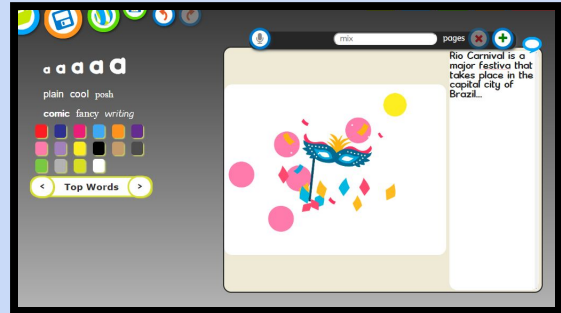

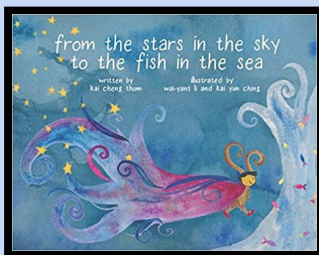
E-Safety

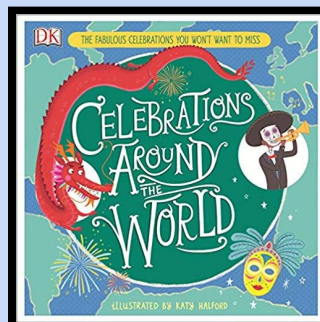
Using JITS
