<p>Use the counting scenes powerpoint attached to the email.</p> <p>Sing the song 10 fat sausages, sizzling in a pan. The following link takes you to a version on BBC schools radio: https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p03rdgn3</p> <p>Make number cards for your child 0-10. Make a collection of objects and find 2 dice to help you carry out some of the following activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Order the numbers 0-10 and 10-0 ● Roll a die, count out the correct number of object and match to the numeral ● Turn all the cards over so your child can't see them, turn a card over and count out the correct number of objects and match the numeral ● Put some dried pasta shapes in a bowl, chose a numeral, use a spoon to scoop up the correct number of pasta pieces and transfer into another bowl/jar ● <p>If you have a printer you could print off the I spy dinosaur counting sheet attached to the email, alternatively you could open the I Spy page and reduce the page size in view and count on the screen.</p>	<p>Use the following link to BBC radio Follow, listen and sing - Dinosaurs: https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-dinosaurs/z6snmfr If you scroll down the page there is a video to go with the song too.</p> <p>Phonics Phoneme 't' - 't' not 'tuh' https://www.twinkl.co.uk/go/resource/t-l-53188-phase-two-phonemes-set-1-t-video</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Sing the Jolly Phonics 't' song - sung to the tune of The Wheels on the Bus - see below <div style="text-align: center;"> </div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Go on a hunt to find objects beginning with 't' ● Think of other objects/things beginning with 't' ● Some children may want to practice forming the letter, starting at the top 'down the tower, across the tower ● magic writing in the air 	<p>Watch this episode of the Go Jettors: https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b06mz6f7/go-jettors-series-1-1-the-eiffel-tower-france</p> <p>Use a map/atlas to find France - explain that it is a country in Europe and that Europe is one of the seven continents of the world.</p> <p>Use the internet with your child to find pictures of the Eiffel tower. Look closely at the pictures and talk about the structure and the patterns.</p> <p>Draw a picture of the Eiffel tower using a pencil paying close attention to detail.</p> <p>Create their own Eiffel tower using any materials/boxes/construction.</p> <p>Click the following link for a dance based on Dinosaurs - listen and move: https://www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/b03g6vh1</p>
